PROVIDED BY SHELTER :

- Your base gas mask, we will accept suggestions or direction on what shape, style and design of gas mask you would like to use and purchase or acquire the mask for you
- Publicizing and promoting your art via social media
- Hanging and suspending your mask on our wall

PROVIDED BY ARTIST :

- Materials to decorate the mask
- Design proof or guidance on project direction before commencement



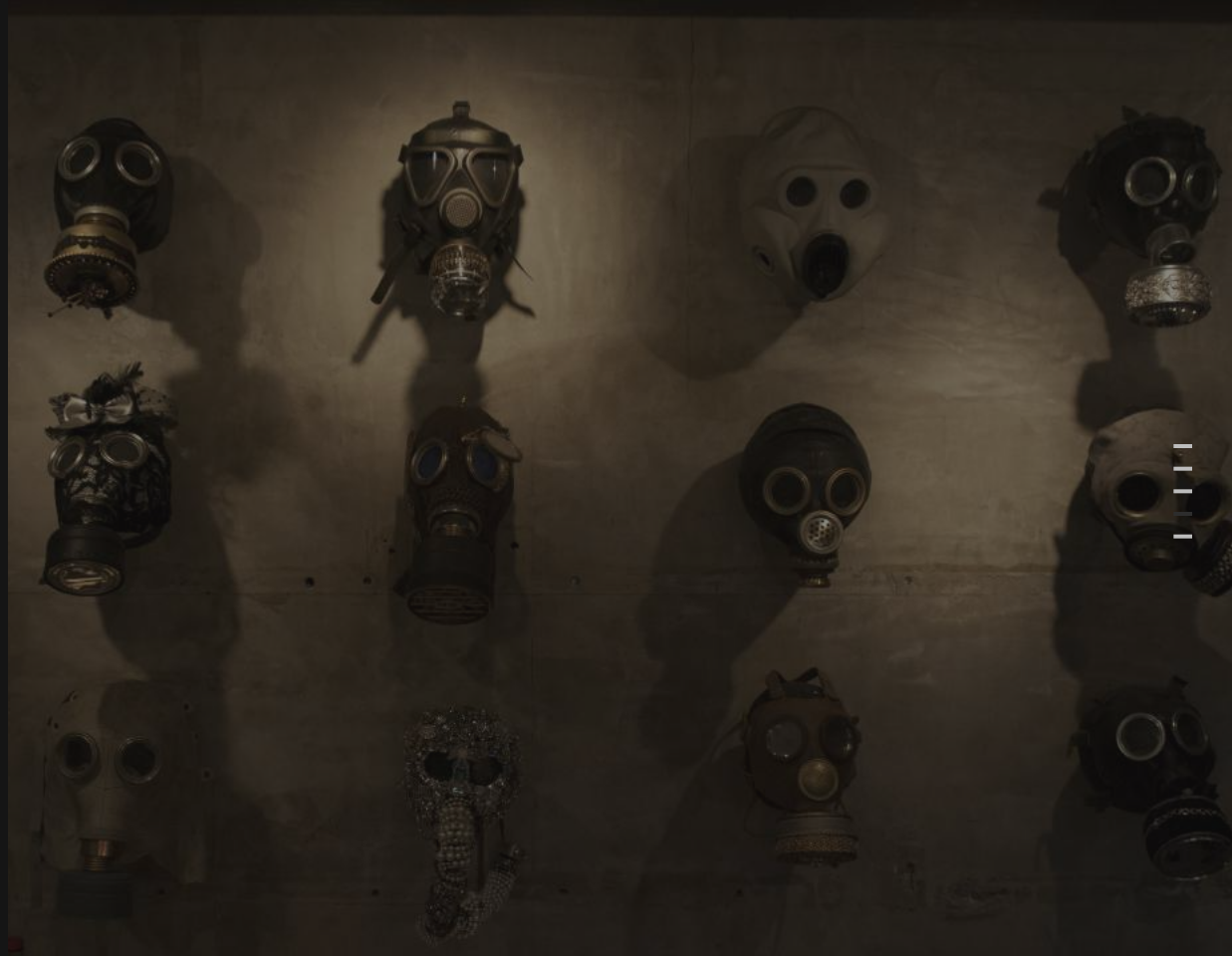
DESIGN SPECS

- Color tones are flexible but limited to muted tones
- Gold, monochrome, brass, iron and black are highly recommended for approval
- “Glam” or “grunge” looks are highly recommended
- Style and themes consistent with the “shelter” concept are highly recommended
- The mask should still be identifiable as a gas mask



PROCESS

- 1 . Artist application with idea
- 2 . Artist approval
- 3 . Gas mask selection
- 4 . Art creation
- 5 . Art submission
- 6 . Art approval
- 7 . Art schedule
- 8 . Art public facing



ADDITIONAL NOTES

- Masks are supported by condensed, foam balls that are driven onto iron pipes from the wall.
- Should the artist require the foam ball prior to their gas mask creation (and not inserted into the headspace area after), please confirm with Shelter before moving ahead.
- Any materials used in the gas mask production (metals, gems, fabrics, decorations, external materials, etc.) should be sent on a moodboard or artist submission should include real samples.
- Art may be rejected at any stage for any reason by SHELTER
- SHELTER is responsible for providing the mask to the artist, all other costs during the art project are the responsibility of the artist. The artist may request Shelter provide monetary or material support prior to their art creation, SHELTER reserves the right to approve or deny these requests based on their own discretion.
